- Each course at RMIT is typically worth 12 credits. A full-time study load consists of 3-4 courses (36-48 credits).
- Upon completing the study, students will be able to access the official and verified digital transcript via the MyeQuals platform and share it with their home institutions.

Visa information

- Visa type: DH - student visa is for study purposes only. International students holding a student visa are not allowed to engage in work or internship activities without the institution's permission.
- Process: Students can expect to receive a Visa Invitation Letter and detailed instructions on how to apply for a student visa approximately two months before the semester starts.

Cost and fees to come on exchange

- Tuition fees: Students enrolled in the exchange program do not pay tuition fees to RMIT University but continue to pay fees to their home institutions.
- [Health insurance](#) is mandatory for all international students while studying at RMIT Vietnam.

Cost of living

The estimated monthly expense ranges from \$600 - \$1,000, including bills:

- Rent: \$250 - \$600
- Food: \$200 - \$300
- Utilities: \$50 - \$100
- Transportation: \$50 - \$70
