NOMINATION PROCESS

Partner universities will be contacted to nominate students to RMIT Australia and Vietnam through a nomination link.



APPLICATION PROCESS

Once nominated by their home university, applicants to RMIT will receive an email with instructions to access the online application form.



NOMINATION DEADLINE

Semester 1 (February - May) 30 September (previous year) Semester 2 (June - September) 31 March (current year)

Semester 3 (October - January) 31 March (current year)


• All courses at RMIT Vietnam are offered in English.

 Upon completion of study at RMIT, students will be able to access the official and verified digital transcript via MyeQuals platform and share it with their home institutions. MyeQuals is an Australian national credentials system that provides certified, legally valid, and tamper-proof academic statements.

ENROLMENT GUIDELINES

Offer letter:

- Student receives Offer Letter from Admissions Office
- Student signs Offer Acceptance Form, list approved courses by priorities and pay compulsory medical insurance.
- Student sends OAF and proof of payment to <u>Admissions office</u> and <u>Global</u>
 <u>Experience Office</u> via email.

Enrol and Create Timetable: Student will receive instruction emails from RMIT to activate their student account, check pre-enrolled courses as well as create timetable on RMIT's system.

Orientation Week: Orientation Week is usually organised one week prior to the start of the semester to deliver student ID card, introduce all support services and important information newbies need to know to get started at RMIT.

After student's study at RMIT Vietnam: Student will lose access to all RMIT systems 24-48 hours after their RMIT program is completed. Student is then encouraged to save any information stored in their student email or on RMIT systems to their own personal device or cloud storage before they complete their study at RMIT.

ENROLMENTS & VISA GUIDELINES

- Visa type: DH student visa is used for studying purpose only and international students holding a student visa are not allowed to engage in working/internship activity without the institution's permission.
- Process: Student could expect to receive Visa Invitation Letter and detailed instructions to apply for student visa around 2 months prior to the semester start.



ACCOMMODATIONS

COST OF LIVING

- Student could arrive 4 weeks prior to university's start date to have time to arrange long-term accommodation.
- Estimated expense is approximately from \$600 800 per month, including bills:
 - Internet: \$15
 - Food: \$100-200
 - Accommodation: \$350-550
 - Phone + 3G: \$14-20
 - Electricity, gas, water: \$50
 - Transportation: 40-50 cents/km (for taxi)
