Introduction

The Sustainable Development Research Cluster focuses on three sustainable development goals (SDGs) which are good health & wellbeing, climate action, and, the partnerships for the goals, respectively. The cluster works in collaboration with the School of Business and Management's Smart Cities Hub and has been successful in securing projects that address these SDGs.

Current research projects include a five-year European Union Horizon 2020 project on Urban GreenUP, an Erasmus Plus project with Nantes University, France on "Strengthen the production, management and outreach capacities of research in the field of Water and Natural resources in South-East Asia", and grants from the Vietnamese Ministry of Science and Technology's National Foundation for Science and Technology on "Improving the negotiation skills among nascent entrepreneurs in Vietnam" and many more are used to provide the recommendations for promoting social inclusion and innovation in related topics.
