You can expect to be moving around and exploring Ho Chi Minh City or Hanoi with local guides, putting into practice the theory taught in class. Your three weeks in Southeast Asia will expose you to the country's history, vibrant food, and diverse entertainment!

### / ACADEMIC CREDITS

Students will have the opportunity to obtain credits and participate in social and cultural activities to discover and learn about Vietnam and the Vietnamese culture. Students that pass each of these courses will receive an official RMIT University transcript. Each course is valued at 12 RMIT credit points which is equivalent to 7.5 ECTS (in Europe) or 3 credits (in the US).

# Cost of living

Vietnam is an affordable place to live and the cost of rent, food, transport and utilities is a fraction of what you'd pay in most countries. The following estimates are based on a single student living in shared accommodation.

### Weekly expenses

Food	\$25-\$50
Phone and internet	\$7-\$9
Public transport	Up to \$0.50 per km
